QUALIFICATIONS EXPLAINED

LLB

Award granted on completion of 16 modules over a 2 to 4 year period. On completion of the LLB you will obtain a professional Bachelor degree.

Graduate Certificate (Grad Cert)

If you do not possess an undergraduate/first degree then this qualification will allow you access to a specialised postgraduate area of study, otherwise unavailable to you.

Postgraduate Certificate (PgCert)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 60 credits.

Postgraduate Diploma (PgDip)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 120 credits. If you get a diploma you will have gained 120 of the 180 credits you need for a masters degree.

Masters (MSc/LLM)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 180 credits and typically includes a dissertation. This will enable you to consolidate and apply the skills and knowledge gained in your earlier postgraduate study.

Doctorate (PhD/PD)

Application is normally to MSc/MRes with transfer to a PhD dependent on satisfactory progress around 12 months.

CAREER OPTIONS IN... LAW

CORPORATE LAWYER

A corporate lawyer ensures the legality of commercial transactions, advising corporations on their legal rights and duties, including the duties and responsibilities of corporate officers. In order to do this, they must have knowledge of aspects of contract law, tax law, accounting, securities law, bankruptcy, intellectual property rights, licensing, zoning laws, and the laws specific to the business of the corporations that they work for.

Corporate lawyers structure those transactions, draft documents, review agreements, negotiate deals, and attend meetings. Some corporate lawyers become partners in their firms. Others become in-house counsel for corporations. Others still migrate into other professions such as investment banking and teaching.

CONSTRUCTION LAW ADVISOR

As a construction law advisor you will deal with legal issues relating to the construction process from land acquisition and project financing to post-construction claims settlement. These include such matters as, building contracts, preparation and negotiations on building projects, assisting on areas of procurement of various resources and materials, and advising on environment, health and safety, insurance and other matters.

MEDIATOR

A mediator is a trained professional who helps disputing parties find a mutually acceptable solution to their dispute. They work either as a self-employed mediator or as part of a larger organisation and are involved in international and domestic disputes in almost every area, including family, employment and commercial.

EMPLOYMENT LAW ADVISOR

Compliance with employment law is just one of the many challenges which employers face. As an employment law advisor you may be required to represent both employers and employees in a variety of dispute matters relating to their legal rights; typically you will advise on contracts of employment and their effect, restrictive covenants, settlement agreements, disciplinary and grievance procedures, discrimination issues, and unfair dismissal.

ADJUDICATOR

An adjudicator makes a formal judgment or decision about a problem or disputed matter filed by government against individuals or organisations. This can include determining the existence and amount of liability according to law, administrative and judicial precedents and other evidence, and recommending acceptance or rejection of compromise settlement offers.

Working in any aspect of law requires a wide skill set. Legal professionals need to be able to evaluate, interpret and explain complex information clearly. They should be able to reason and form critical judgments while formulating sound arguments. The ability to write concisely and communicate confidently is important for a career in law. Our specialist law courses are designed for both those who have a background in law and those without any formal legal qualifications, leading you on to a variety of careers in the legal profession.

SOLICITOR

Solicitors give legal advice and explain the law to their clients. They advise both individual and corporate clients on legal aspects of their personal and business affairs. They act on behalf of their clients, in court and throughout negotiations, as well as prepare and research documents, letters and other paperwork. Solicitors work in private law firms, central and local government, banks and other commercial organisations. The Scottish legal profession has its own entry and training arrangements.

Becoming a Solicitor

After graduating with an LLB, aspiring solicitors must complete the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice. This one year course (2 yrs part-time) aims to give you the professional skills that you can use in practice. Once you receive your Diploma in Professional Legal Practice you must complete a two year professional traineeship with a solicitor.

ADVOCATE/BARRISTER

Advocates in Scotland perform the same role as barristers in England and Wales and Northern Ireland. The Faculty of Advocates, whose elected members administer the Scottish Bar, has just over 460 practising members. In essence, an advocate is a self-employed independent lawyer. Most are based in Parliament House in Edinburgh and work as self-employed individuals, depending on solicitors and some other professionals for their income. A small number are employed within industry or local government. Advocates who build up successful practices can apply to 'take silk' (become Queen's Counsel – QC) after about 12 years.

Typical work activities include: preparing for cases and liaising with solicitors; presenting cases and representing clients in courts, tribunals and public enquiries; providing specialist legal representation and advice to solicitors and appropriate professional bodies in written opinions or at consultations.

OIL AND GAS LAWYER

An oil and gas lawyer focuses on the main legal issues within today's oil and gas industry and ensures the legality of commercial transactions relating to oil and gas companies, advising corporations on their legal rights and duties. Oil and gas lawyers will be expected to advise clients on various business entities involving the oil and gas industry, including advise on the day-to-day operational aspects of the oil and gas business and mergers and acquisitions.

MOOTING AT THE LAW SCHOOL

The Law School annually enters a team in the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot. It is one of the world's most prestigious international moot court competitions for law students. The goal of the Moot is to foster the study of international commercial law and arbitration for resolution of international business disputes. The Moot has been held annually since 1994 attracting the ever increasing number of law schools from all around the world, and is sponsored by a number of prominent academic and arbitral institutions.

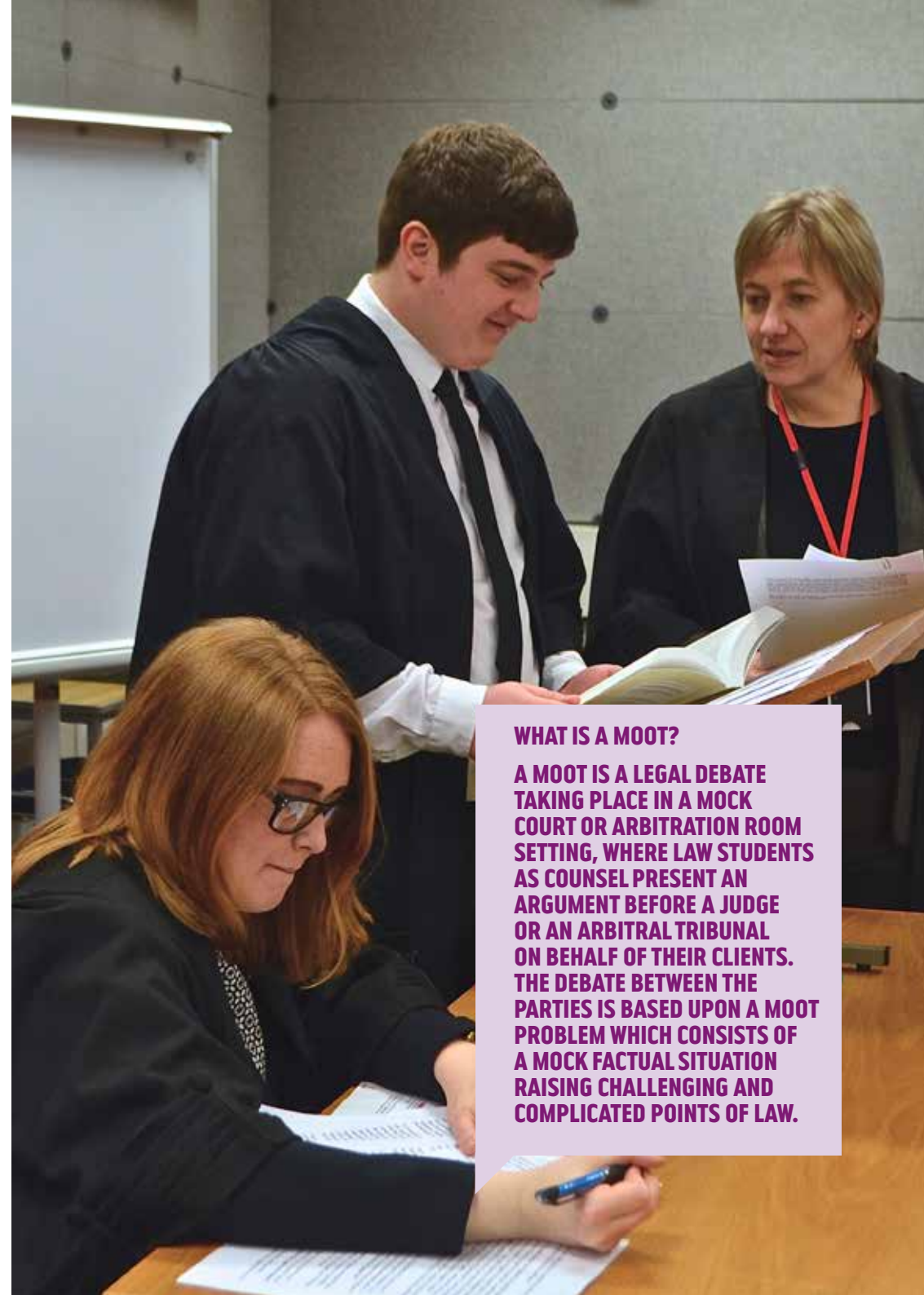
The student team is responsible for writing two memoranda, one for the Claimant (due in early December) and one for the Respondent (due in January). After the briefs are submitted, the team prepares intensively for the oral argument phase of the competition.

The team may consist of undergraduate and postgraduate (including PhDs), on-campus as well as distance learning students located in any country. Above all, the team is recruited of passionate, enthusiastic, hardworking and internationally-minded students who are up for this challenge.

The Moot is a tough challenge, and requires very significant time commitments and effort. In most law schools, being selected as a team member is in itself an acknowledgement of excellence. Many former "mooties" have described their participation in the Moot as an experience of a lifetime.

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The online LLB law degree is designed for those who wish to obtain an LLB but are unable to attend an on-campus course. It is accredited by the Law Society of Scotland and the course has been developed around the Foundation Programme requirements of the Law Society.

The course offers a flexible learning route, and is designed to provide you with key knowledge across all the main areas of Scots Law, including commercial law, property law, criminal law, family law, public law and other important areas.

Through the online course, you will develop key skills which include; research and analytical skills, along with team working, presentation and writing skills.

HOW YOU WILL STUDY

Our supported distance learning mode of delivery allows you to study online from any location and is designed to fit in around your work commitments. You will be taught and supported by experienced industry professionals who will recreate the same challenging interactive format of the on-campus courses for those studying at a distance.

Our virtual learning environment, CampusMoodle offers students flexibility of where and when they can study, offering full and open access to tutors and other class members. Students have the benefit of being part of a group of learners with the invaluable opportunity to participate in active, group-related learning within a supportive online community setting. As online learners, students are part of a 'virtual cohort' and the communication and interaction amongst members of the cohort is a significant aspect of the learning process.

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

There are 16 subject modules for the Online LLB course. Modules are the same for each mode, and the delivery times of these will depend on whether you choose to study part-time (standard), part-time (accelerated) or full-time. Subjects studied on this course are:

BENEFITS TO YOU

An LLB qualification can be used for entry or advancement into the legal profession or other areas such as energy, government or journalism sectors. This online course is available on a part-time basis (with standard and accelerated options) and is available on a full-time basis from 2012.

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

The Online LLB is designed as a graduate entry qualification. Applicants will be expected to have a Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in a relevant discipline such as law, business, management, history, modern studies, journalism or other similar subject.

Applicants who do not have a degree in a relevant discipline may still obtain entry under one of the following criteria:

Has a Bachelor's degree in a non-relevant discipline AND can present a reasoned case for wishing to embark on a law degree;

OR

Does not have a Bachelor's degree BUT the applicant can demonstrate that he/she has the intellectual ability required to undertake an LLB degree. This will usually be evidenced by a mixture of non-degree level qualifications combined with relevant industry/practice work experience.

The Course Leader has the sole discretion to accept or refuse any application for entry to the course and must be satisfied that each applicant will be able to devote sufficient time to the course and of successfully completing the course.

SINCE THE LAUNCH OF THE DIPLOMA COURSE IN SEPTEMBER 2005, THE FEEDBACK FROM PARTICIPATING STUDENTS HAS SHOWN THEIR HIGH DEGREE OF SATISFACTION WITH THE COURSE. A REAL MARK OF THIS SUCCESS IS THAT 75% OF THE STUDENTS HAVE ALREADY FOUND TRAINEESHIPS WITH LEGAL FIRMS.

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Diploma in Professional Legal Practice enables graduates to practice as solicitors in Scotland. This is an accredited PEAT 1 course accredited by the Law Society of Scotland.

After completion of an LLB Degree from a Scottish university, or the professional examinations of The Law Society of Scotland, those who intend to become solicitors in Scotland are required to undertake the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice.

The course is studied full-time over 26 weeks although there may be an option to complete the course on a part-time basis (over 2 years).

HOW YOU WILL LEARN

In full time and part-time mode, you will learn through a combination of lectures, seminars and workshop sessions. These comprise of a mix of group study, discussion, simulation and presentations of findings by teams and individuals. You will work as an individual and also as part of a team on case studies, team activities, presentations and discussions.

Access to our virtual learning environment, CampusMoodle, is also provided giving you access from home to learning materials (including videos, e-books and journals).

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

This Diploma in Professional Legal Practice core modules are as follows:

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

To gain admission to the Diploma course entrants require to obtain passes in certain "core" subjects (prerequisite professional subjects) in their LLB Degree from a Scottish university.

Alternatively you will have undertaken a pre-Diploma training contract and completed the Law Society of Scotland's professional qualifying examinations.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply for entry to the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice you must complete the application form specific to the Diploma.

Applications made on the standard Robert Gordon University postgraduate application form will not be considered.

Those wishing to apply for a place on the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice:

- Will graduate LLB from Robert Gordon University in 2014, or earlier; OR
- Are engaged on a pre-Diploma Training Contract;
- Will graduate LLB from another Scottish University in 2014 or earlier
