Full-time study

QUALIFICATIONS EXPLAINED

If you don't want to commit to studying a full Masters degree, you can complete single modules and work towards the following exit awards:

Graduate Certificate (Gradcert)

This is an access to Masters course. The award of a Graduate Certificate in Management Studies is equivalent to SVQ level 4/SCQF level 9 management training. The three modules are studied one at a time, over one academic year, and are assessed by a course work assignment at the end of each module.

Postgraduate Certificate (PgCert)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 60 credits.

Postgraduate Diploma (PgDip)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 120 credits. If you get a diploma you will have gained 120 of the 180 credits you need for a masters degree.

Masters (MSc/MBA)

Award granted on completion of modules that accumulate to 180 credits and typically includes a dissertation. This will enable you to consolidate and apply the skills and knowledge gained in your earlier postgraduate study.

Doctorate (PhD/PD)

Application is normally to MSc/MRes with transfer to a PhD dependent on satisfactory progress around 12 months.

CAREER OPTIONS IN... INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

Information managers have a key strategic role in organisations and handle all kinds of information including scientific, technical, legal, commercial, financial and economic. They organise, manage and develop information products and systems, which are used to store, analyse and retrieve data. Information managers work primarily with electronic resources and ICT systems, and increasingly less with paper-based ones.

INFORMATION OFFICER

An information officer manages and develops the procurement, supply and distribution of information for an organisation or client in support of their needs or objectives. Services may be provided internally and/or externally and deal with electronic information, especially online databases and internet resources, as well as traditional library materials.

INFORMATION SCIENTIST

Information scientists organise, manage and develop information systems, which are used to store, analyse and retrieve data for clients. They work primarily with electronic resources and ICT systems, to source and research the information that is required. They also develop new systems such as databases and are often involved in the creation of web content.

RECORDS MANAGER

A records manager is responsible for the management of an organisation's records and increasingly involves advising on records management issues. There is also an increased understanding of the value of effective knowledge and information management, particularly in the corporate sector. The demands of legislation, such as the Data Protection Act and the Freedom of Information Act, have also broadened the reach of this role.

DIGITAL CURATOR

Digital Curators work in a variety of sectors and ensure the preservation and long-term access to digital information assets such as library and museum collections, industry or academic and research data. Digital Curators have technical, leadership, project management and communication skills and may oversee all stages of digital curation from the conversion of artefacts in physical format to digital, through to facilitating access within the context of changing technologies and standards.

KNOWLEDGE MANAGER

Knowledge managers are responsible for strategic issues related to learning, business intelligence, intellectual assets and agility. Often this also involves influencing organisational culture to enable better knowledge sharing. This may include introducing advanced practices to improve knowledge creation and sharing, such as tools for building a corporate memory, enabling virtual forums, stewarding communities of practice, and assisting with informal learning.

LIBRARIAN

A librarian is responsible for the acquisition, organisation, promotion and dissemination of a wide range of resources to meet the diverse needs of library users. Typical activities include: creating, updating and managing information resources – both electronic and printed; managing budgets; dealing with enquiries and assisting library users; and maintaining relationships with external agencies.

ARCHIVIST

Archivists acquire, manage and maintain documents and other materials that have historical importance for individuals, organisations and nations. The role is key in preserving memories and records that shape various groups within society. Archives are held by many organisations including local and national government, businesses and academic institutions. They may include papers, maps, photographs and films. Recently a large part of the role is related to making information accessible to users, increasingly in digital format.

INFORMATION SYSTEMS MANAGER

An information systems manager is responsible for the computer systems within a company, overseeing installation, ensuring backup systems operate effectively, purchasing hardware and software, providing the ICT technology infrastructures for an organisation, and contributing to organisational policy regarding quality standards and strategic planning. They work in every size of organisation and industry, usually with technicians, programmers and database administrators.

SYSTEMS LIBRARIAN

A systems librarian is responsible for maintaining the variety of systems within the library. They manage all library systems including upgrades to library catalogues, electronic research databases and the website of the library. Systems librarians support staff with training and use of these systems. They will also create online services for specific purposes such as subject guides, periodicals search and online tutorials. Often they will also obtain and evaluate statistics and present reports to improve the use of library systems.

DOCUMENT CONTROLLER

Document controllers (or document specialists) work across a wide variety of industries including biotechnology, financial, clinical and technological. Document control consists of managing all commercial and technical documents within an organisation; implementing processes and tools; providing system reports; maintaining and updating electronic information systems; distributing documents; and ensuring accuracy of all documentation – all of which are essential functions of this role. Ensuring regulatory procedures and changes are followed is also an essential part of the job.

LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT CO-ORDINATOR

A learning and development co-ordinator will have responsibility for the development and enhancement of organisational learning programmes. This will require individuals with with strong written and verbal communication skills as well as a sound knowledge of teaching and learning in an organisational context. This type of role is now found in many different types of organisation from commercial to not-for-profit organisations, including local authorities and charities.

COURSE OVERVIEW

This innovative course provides flexible entry to an education in the library and information management field.

The course has been designed as an access route for those with work experience in the sector who do not currently have the necessary educational qualifications in this area.

On completion of the Graduate Certificate, students are able to gain access to any of our Masters Degree courses at the Department of Information Management (Information and Library Studies, Information Management, Digital Curation and Organisational Learning) and also enhances professional career development.

The entire course is delivered online, allowing you to fit study around your lifestyle, and to interact with tutors and fellow students from all over the world.

The access course also aims to develop the study, research and learning skills of the students in order to prepare them for Masters level study.

You will study four modules over the academic year, each one assessed with a coursework assignment when the module ends.

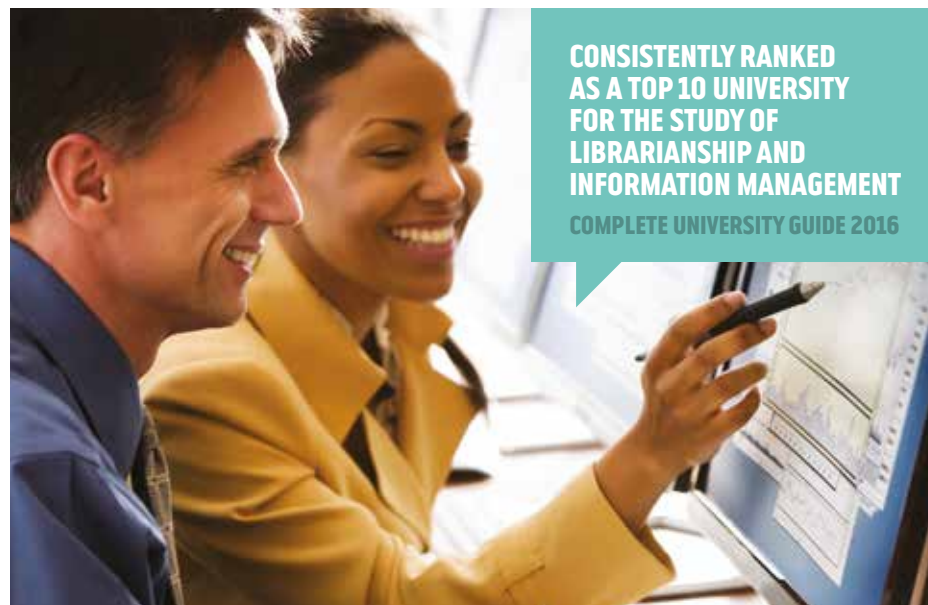

COURSE OVERVIEW

This innovative new course developed in collaboration with CDA (Common Data Access Ltd) provides flexible entry to an education in the field of petroleum data management.

The course has been designed as an access route for those with relevant work experience in the energy sector who do not currently have the necessary qualifications in this area. The course facilitates access to any of our Masters Degree courses available from the Department of Information Management (Information Management, Digital Curation, Information and Library Studies, and Organisational Learning), and enhances professional career development.

You will be able to draw upon your current and previous work experience within the modules. This approach will allow you to analyse both the organisation and its approach to petroleum data management, and to utilise the course content to improve strategic organisational effectiveness. In addition, it encourages you to consider any practical problems that may arise in the execution of any activities, and to reflect critically on the value of your own organisational input.

HOW YOU WILL LEARN

The course will be offered online. Our supported distance learning mode of delivery allows you to study online from any location and is designed to fit in around any existing work commitments. on group-related activities.

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

The Petroleum Data Management Graduate Certificate aims to promote the understanding of subsurface exploration and production data and evaluate its importance to upstream oil and gas businesses. The course focuses on managing subsurface exploration and production data throughout its life cycle from capture to realisation until it becomes obsolete.

You will study four modules over the academic year, each assessed through coursework assignments:

- Managing Subsurface Exploration and Production Data
- The Data Management Life Cycle
- Providing Data Management Services
- Data Quality and Governance

COURSE OVERVIEW

The CILIP accredited MSc Digital Curation course has been designed to equip students with theoretical knowledge and practical skills to ensure the long-term preservation and maintenance of digital data and information.

The Masters course has been developed to cover key professional skills including: technological developments, knowledge organisation, stakeholder engagement, data governance and project management.

Digital Curation is essential because of the huge increase in digital information and the need for organisations to add value to digital assets to ensure they can be: stored, accessed, reused and transformed for future research, business and cultural applications.

Digital Curation also enables new opportunities for data visualisation, user engagement and for the co-production of content.

The course has relevance to multiple industries including: business data management, cultural and heritage organisations, the library and information science sector (including academic research data management) and public sector data management.

COURSE OVERVIEW

The course will enable you to obtain a professional qualification accredited by the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals (CILIP) and recognised by the profession worldwide.

Our Librarianship and Information Management courses have been rated **Top in the UK for Librarianship and Information Management** in The Complete University Guide 2014 subject tables.

This course has been one of the enduring successes of Robert Gordon University, bringing together a mixture of theory and practice that replicates activities found in the workplace.
