

About Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire

Aberdeen is Scotland's third largest city, celebrated for its proximity to the sea and its famous sparkling architecture - The Scotsman called it "one of the most architecturally distinctive in Europe".

The city is surrounded by Aberdeenshire, stretching from "one of the last great places on earth" (Cairngorms) to "one of the world's top-rated coastlines" (National Geographic). We like to call it *majestic* Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire.

Our region is easy to navigate and is wellconnected. It can be explored by foot, bike, bus or car.

When you're not studying check out our beautiful beaches and quirky coastal villages, or head deep into our countryside and visit majestic Lochs.






Aberdeenshire is even known as 'Scotland's Castle Country' thanks to the 263 enchanting castles that were once here, many of which you can still explore today.

Aberdeenshire is the gateway to the largest national park in the UK, Cairngorms







