INTERMEDIATE PHOTOGRAPHY

Please find below a list of suggested materials for your Short Course. These will be discussed at the beginning and throughout the course. You are most welcome to contact Neal Murray about your course materials: neal@nealmurray.com.

Please bring a basic sketchbook to classes in order to record ideas and processing procedures. Some of the following materials are required for the course:

35mm SLR Film Camera	• The 35mm film camera should be easy to set manually and ideally has a built in light meter. These cameras are readily available to buy second-hand from a variety of online sources from around £50 upwards, depending on the make and model (make sure that a lens is included). If you do not already have a camera, then you may prefer to consult with your tutor at the start of the course before making a purchase. Non zoom lenses give better results than zoom lenses, zoom lenses are not so sharp, especially older ones (unless very expensive). Wide angle lenses such as 28mm might offer more scope for creativity. A standard lens is 50mm and wide angle lenses are typically 24mm and 28mm. 50mm and 28mm lenses are usually not too expensive and give great results.
Photographic Paper	 ILFORD MULTIGRADE IV, MG1V, RESIN COATED Glossy, 12x16 50 sheet Box or A4 100 sheet Box are two examples of ideal sizes. FIBRE BASED PAPER – It's difficult to use but gives great results.
Film	 100 ISO FILMS Ilford FP4 Ilford DELTA 100 Fuji NEOPAN ACROS 100 400 ISO FILMS KODAK TRI-X FUJI NEOPAN 400 ILFORD HP5 400
Useful Filters	 RED R(25A) or 8X Red - must have for Infra-Red Film and for dramatic skies on any film. NEUTRAL DENSITY ND8 - For giving long exposures especially when combined with RED R(25A). YELLOW - Good for improving skies on Black and White film.

These can be expensive. Always keep a look out for second-hand filters to fit your lenses.

- Sketchbook Sketchbook A5 or A4 (ring bound).
- Stationery 35mm Negative storage sheets (such as KENRO 35mm Glassine 25 Page Pack approx. £6)and ring binder).
